

Product Tech Sheet Nitro Radish

Brassica species are a popular option for cover crops. They are known for improving soil health, increasing water holding capacity and relieving compaction. Brassica species are also popular for livestock producers to use for fall or winter grazing.

Radish is one of the most common cover crops due to its ease of establishment! Radish offers a large taproot that is excellent at relieving soil compaction. It also increases organic matter and water holding capacity, provides forage and helps to suppress weeds.

Radishes are great in mixes with oats or annual ryegrass or legumes!



Seeding Method: Drill or broadcast

Seeding Rate: 2-4#/acre in a mix

Seeding Depth: 1/4"

Seeding Dates: 7/15 - 9/10

Notes: Less winter hardy than turnips or brassicas.
